This July 4th— Independence Day— complete with fireworks and backyard barbecues, will mark 240 years since the American colonists declared their freedom from England.

Sometimes, though, we get so caught up in celebrating our freedom that we often forget that freedom is not an American innovation at all! The truth of the matter is that no country can rightly claim liberty as its own invention. Freedom was conceived in the mind of God! As we read in the book of Genesis in the Holy Bible, chapters 1 and 2. God created man (Adam) and woman (Eve). It also appears that although He placed restrictions on their behavior (that is, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil"). He also endowed them with a free will and the option of making choices concerning their

The apostle Paul writes to the Galatian Christians: "You, my

brothers, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature!" (Galatians 5:13)
We all should ask ourselves daily, "Do I exercise my free will to the greater glory of God in order that I might be a positive witness for Jesus Christ?" "Do I exercise my freedom of choice in ways that honor and please God, or do I grieve Him with my misbehavior and disobedience?"

Let's remember, freedom is a double-edged sword with potential for both good and evil. Our freedom is most effectively and faithfully borne within the sheath of the principles of biblical morality found in God's Word, and when wielded by an arm of obedience to His perfect will.


